ITALIC Teaching Assistant, Fall Quarter 2020

Position Description

ITALIC is a year-long course for first-year students, which explores the nature of art and art-making across the disciplines.

Working closely with the teaching team of Stanford faculty and the program's Associate Director, the ITALIC Teaching Assistant's core responsibilities are to lead one discussion section (50 min, 2x per week), grade that section's papers, participate in grade norming and assignment creation, and offer individualized instruction to students outside of class. The Teaching Assistant will also attend ITALIC's main lectures two times per week and occasional events held outside of class, such as remote field trips or artist talks. There are also opportunities for the ITALIC Teaching Assistant to deliver occasional lectures or art-making workshops in the main course.

Qualifications

The successful candidate will demonstrate excellence in college-level teaching. Must be sensitive to the particular demands of teaching first year students and committed to effective, engaging, student-centered pedagogy. Exceptional communication skills and experience in team-taught courses is also welcomed.

Expertise in Art History, Music, Theater and Performance, Dance Studies, Film Studies, Literature or related arts and humanities disciplines is necessary. Interdisciplinary scholars are especially encouraged to apply.
